Subway Employee, ██████████, contacted BPD to report a male, later identified as Curt Carbone, brandished a weapon inside of Subway during a verbal altercation over an online order.

████████ provided BPD dispatch with information in regards to the direction in which Curt left the plaza where Subway is located. ██████ said Curt took a left onto North Main Street out of the plaza and was heading towards Cedar Street in a Gray Honda Civic bearing CT registration FUN1 and that he believed there was female sitting in the passenger seat of the vehicle. BPD dispatch then began to relay this information to officers. While officers were responding, dispatch notified officers the caller believed the gun was black, was not pointed at anyone and there were no injuries reported. Sgt. Romanello also notified all responding units if the vehicle was found, it should be treated as a high risk stop.

As BPD dispatch was giving out information in regards to the vehicle description and direction of travel, I was traveling Southbound on Brushy Plain Road heading toward Cedar Street in my patrol cruiser. I remained traveling slowly on Cedar Street prior to the

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good night. He started walking out and turned back for a bag. At this point I was not near the register so I told him to grab a bag himself that's when he started yelling again. He then told me I was an asshole and someone needs to do something about me. At some point I asked what he was gonna do about it he brandished a gun out of a cross body bag. That's when I informed him that I was gonna call the police to which I did."

Another employee present during the incident, [REDACTED] provided a written statement which read the following.

"He came into pick up an online order. While [REDACTED] is making his sandwich and asked for extra veggies. [REDACTED] told him he had to charge him and he got loud with him and violent. He was being unnecessarily loud and getting violent and said really rude things to [REDACTED]. He said to me "if she was taking my order I bet she would do this no problem" and I responded saying "its our job" and told him he was wrong for bringing up [REDACTED] body and gender. He pulled out a gun and when [REDACTED] said he was going to call the police he left."

Video surveillance was viewed by Ofc. Clyburn which was saved on her officer worn body camera and uploaded to Evidence.com. Video surveillance shows Carbone reach into a black, cross body bag and partially remove an item before putting it back in. Video confirms [REDACTED] version of events. While speaking to [REDACTED], she described the gun as "small, all black and with no attachments" on it. This description matches the gun found in the bag which Carbone said the gun was in. Prior to leaving, Carbone told [REDACTED] the gun was fake, however, [REDACTED] not being a person familiar with firearms did not know if it was real or not.

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
